United Way volunteers have established a way to recognize the top donors of the organization, creating the Pillar Society for individuals giving at leadership levels. In 1996, the first year there was a Pillar Society event, there were 49 Pillars .



Today, there are over 300, who combined to give over \$270,000

## ABOUT ELDCHRIST WINERY



Eldchrist Winery is committed to providing a full winery experience for the people of Union and Madison Counties in Ohio. We produce hand-crafted wines in small batches. Our winemaking facility is a restored pole-barn.

The Winery Tasting Room is open on Fridays from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 2:00 to 8:00 p.m. Ladies Night is held on the second Thursday of every month from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m. And LIVE MUSIC is played on the last Friday of every month beginning at 7:30 p.m.

We have planted a variety of grapes. *Vinifera* is the name of grape varieties of European origin. *Gruener Veltliner* is pronounced GROO-ner VELT-lie-ner. You can also call it by its nickname, "Groovy". It is a white wine grape from Austria. Its reputation is growing on the world stage. *Cabernet Franc* is the parent grape of Cabernet Sauvignon. It makes a fantastic red wine in its own right. It generally grows in a cooler climate than Cabernet Sauvignon.

Cornell University in New York is focused on developing new grape varieties (New York Hybrids) that are suited for our particular climate. *Traminette* is a white wine grape. It is similar to a tart Riesling or a Gewurtraminer. *New York 95.0301.01* is a red wine grape with high disease resistance and potential to produce red wines of good quality. It's nicknamed, "No Spray Red."

The University of Minnesota is developing grape varieties that can withstand the extreme cold winters and short growing season. These hardy vines should have no trouble surviving our climate. *La Crescent* is a white wine grape. It produces a wine with distinctive Pear flavors. *Marquette* is a red wine grape that is a cousin of Pinot Noir.

**UNITED WAY BRINGS 24/7 INFORMATION AND REFERRAL HOTLINE TO UNION COUNTY**

You know that if you have an emergency at any time of the day, you can pick up the phone and dial 9-1-1 to be connected to local police, fire, and medics. But what if you received an eviction notice and needed rent assistance? Wanted to know if there were programs that helped with home repair? Or want to talk about an aging parent who needs help to remain living independently?

Union County residents are now able to dial 2-1-1 to be connected to a 24/7 hotline for information and referral to access local human services.

2-1-1 is United Way's response to a gap identified in the 2011 Community Needs Assessment about a lack of public information for available community services. Survey respondents reported that they struggle to navigate the social service network in Union County and didn't know where they could turn for help. So in collaboration with a number of funding partners, United Way is contracting with Helpline of Delaware and Morrow Counties to staff the hotline, maintain a database of available services, and update a website. 2-1-1 promises to end that confusion and serve as the community's first call for help.

"It's another way for people to get connected for those things that happen in the middle of the night or the middle of the weekend when most offices are closed," said Susan Hanson, who has been Helpline's Executive Director for the last 17 years. "Their problem might be able to wait until the next day. But at the very least, there's someone on the other end of the line to talk them through their problem, make a plan, or get them the resources they need right away."

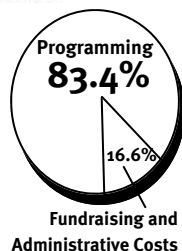
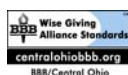


## REDUCED OVERHEAD

For the fifth straight year, United Way will issue a record-level of financial support to local programs that support thousands of Union County residents. The Board of Trustees approved \$725,370 in program support at its January meeting. That's up 6.6% from last year's total. We were able to make that investment even though donations to the annual campaign were off about \$10,000 from a year ago.

A complete recap of 2013 funding is detailed on the next two pages. The amount of funding requested by local agencies was \$86,000 more than the money available to allocate.

"The overall theme that the Community Investment Committee displayed would best be described as 'immediate needs,'" said Mike Rose of Union Rural Electric and committee volunteer. "Those agencies that provide for food or shelter would take priority."

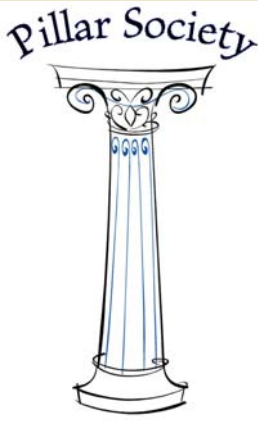
